

For nearly 16 years, Tim Murphy has led the way in growing Bridgeway Community Health into a premier provider of treatment for individuals suffering from addictions.

What began in 2009 as a group of 41 committed individuals with a \$500,000 loan and only one location has grown into a well-oiled operation with more than 180 employees and seven homes designed to help serve members of the community.

To date, Bridgeway has served thousands of individuals, helping them break free from addictions, mental health struggles, and much more.

In January of 2025, Tim reached the end of his tenure as CEO, handing the reins over to his successor, Carlos Texidor Maldonado.

True to form, however, his work has not fully come to an end.

He will continue to maintain a presence as "CEO Emeritus" for the company.

Around 2012, he began to think about the future. Tim has always had a grand vision for what Bridgeway would become, and today that dream is closer than ever.

"Someday we will have a campus where we can deliver more services to more people and focus on the services that people want and need," Murphy said.

In 2021, Bridgeway purchased property at 750 Front Street in Salem, Oregon. This was the first step toward this grand vision.

Later, in 2024, Bridgeway broke ground on what will become the new Bridgeway Community Health Medical Facility. This expansion will nearly double the current size of the campus on Front Street.

The new addition will include sobering stations for individuals who need a place to sober up instead of being taken to jail. It will be the new location of the primary care clinic, as well as the location for the Medically Managed Detox operation. It will be home to a fully equipped commercial kitchen, which will be used to provide high-quality meals to the clients who
